HR 881: To restrict federal DHS funding to colleges that host a Confucius Institute or an educational or technical program funded or administered by Red China or by a Chinese college involved with Chinese military, police, or intellectual activities. HR 1005: To prohibit public elementary and secondary schools from accepting funds or making contracts with the Red Chinese government or its communist party or lose federal funding. HR 1048: To require colleges to annually disclose to the Dept. of Education, if they receive a gift from a hostile foreign nation and the dollar amount or receive a gift or contract from a foreign source valued at \$50,000 or more. To prohibit colleges from making contracts with a foreign nation or entity without obtaining a waiver. Requires colleges to disclose gifts or contracts between staff and foreign sources. H. Res. 189: To censure Democrat Rep. Al Green (TX.) for disrupting President Trump's address to Congress by heckling him, shouting about his "no mandate" to cut Medicaid, and waving his cane, leading to his temporary removal from the chamber, a rare formal rebuke for violating House decorum.
